



The bar charts show the number of males and female students who studied in Canada over a 30 year period. Data is given for women and men for select years between 1980 and 2010. Overall, more full time students than part time students were enrolled.

Firstly, information is given for male students. In 1980, about 4500 men studied full time in Canada. Over the next 30 years, the number of male full time students fell. Year 2000, showed the lowest enrollment with about 3500 full time male students. In terms of part time students, enrollment increased slightly over 30 years. Part time male students increased from about 1500 in 1980 to about 1800 in 2010.

The second bar chart shows information for female students in Canada. The number of female students increased from 2400 in 1980 to about 4800 in 2010. The number of part time female students rose less substantially. About 1000 females studied on a part time basis in 1980 and that figure rose to about 2100 in 2010.

All in all, more students were enrolled in full time studies than in part time programs in Canada. Also, the number of females studying increased over 30 years while the number of men studying remained basically stable.
